Tourist information

An important emporium for salt, wine and cereals since the Middle Ages, Korneuburg is famous for its main square with the town hall in Neo-Gothic style and the city tower from the 15th century. In 1943, the „Kaiser-Wilhelm-Institut für Kulturpflanzenforschung“ was established nearby on the Tutenhof under director Hans Stubbe; the institute which was later transferred to Gatersleben is now known as the IPK.
